
# THE RECIPE FOR GRIT?



### ...STEP FIVE: GARNISH WITH GRATITUDE AND SERVE WITH SELF-CONTROL

I recently read an article in the Frisco Style magazine entitled "They Taught Me." It was written by former mayor of Frisco Bob Warren and he speaks about the role of teachers in his life, the importance that report cards had on his education, and the development of his character. He writes these words:

In addition to reporting our grades in subjects such as reading, writing, spelling and arithmetic, we were graded on deportment, a measure of how well we behaved in the classroom. The report also reflected how many times we were tardy or absent. And the end of every school year, much sought after certificates were awarded to those who were not tardy or absent during the year.



Decades later here we are still providing report cards to students. And we're still giving out awards. This year our awards focus on that powerful four letter word we call "grit". What if our report cards did the same? There is a district in California that is doing just that. Students take home an academic report card and they also take home "grit" report cards that give parents an idea of how students are developing the character traits of zest, optimism, curiosity, social IQ, self-control, and gratitude. There is some debate on whether this is a good idea or not but it does raise a good question: how do we know if our students are truly developing grit?

Our last two ingredients in the recipe for grit might be the answer to that very question: GRATITUDE and SELF-CONTROL. Of all six ingredients they are the most visible signs of the fortitude and character that is building within a student's life.

Around Purefoy we define gratitude as recognizing what other people do for you and showing appreciation for opportunities to learn and expand. It's an attitude that permeates our talk and our walk. If we are truly grateful others will see it. And that's true with self-control as well. We tell students that self-control means paying attention rather than getting distracted. It's remaining calm rather than losing your temper. It's allowing others to speak rather than interrupting. Like gratitude, self-control is an outward expression of the character that is developing below the surface in a person's life. It doesn't take a report card to see these two expressions of grit. You recognize them the moment you're in their presence.

As I was working on this it occurred to me that self-control and gratitude have a shared and powerful danger: entitlement. Ever been around someone who comes across as entitled? These kinds of people don't want to work for something that they perceive as already theirs. They have difficulty showing thankfulness for things that they view already are owed to them. Patience is not their virtue. After all, if it's mine I should have it ... now ... right? Entitlement is a huge block for the development of grit because it keeps us from developing the self-control and the gratitude that is needed for successfully accomplishing our dreams and goals. Like water and oil, grit and entitlement just don't mix.

Garnish with gratitude and serve with self-control. The recipe isn't complete without these two ingredients. When it comes to gratitude perhaps Eckhart Tolle said it best: "Acknowledging the good that you already have in your life is the foundation for all abundance." Or consider the very wise words of Benjamin Franklin: "Educate your children to self-

control, to the habit of holding passion and prejudice and evil tendencies subject to an upright and reasoning will and you have done much to abolish misery from their future and crimes from society."

So there you have it ... the six ingredients of Grit: zest, curiosity, self-control, optimism, social IQ, and gratitude. When it comes to grit it's good to have the ingredients of the recipe laid out in front of us so it will come out just right in the lives of our students.

### **PTA Membership**


We had a wonderful year for membership. We finished the year with a 95% membership from our teachers and parents here at Purefoy! Thank you everyone for the support for our children and students.


