For safety reasons, I am unable to send medication home with students – a parent/guardian must pick up the medication. MEDICATION THAT IS NOT PICKED UP BY 1:00 P.M ON SATURDAY, JUNE 3rd WILL BE THROWN OUT – we cannot store medication over the summer.

If your child borrowed clothing from the clinic, please be sure to wash in hot water and return promptly. The clothing in the clinic comes from donations and is in limited supply.

If your child received immunizations during this past 2016-17 year or receive any during the summer, please send us a new copy of the immunization record so that we can update your child's school information. Just a reminder to those students required immunizamissing tions or needing to update expired Exemption Affidavits - a current copy of the record or the Affidavit must be received by Monday, August 21, 2017 in order for your student to attend school.

Dear Parents,

the During month of April our guidance lessons will focus on test taking skills and success skills. We want out students to feel confident that they have the ability to do their very best on any test! It is actually normal to feel a little nervous or stressed before a test. Sometimes a little anxiety or nervousness can help us stay focused on what we need to do. Some great tips to help vour child do their best are:

- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep the night before a test
- Prepare a healthy breakfast the morning of the test
- Help them practice deep breathing and positive self-talk (*I can do this!!*)
- Arrive at school on time to avoid feeling rushed.
- Tell them that you are confident in their ability and believe they will try their best.




