Ogle Elementary School and the parents of the students participating in activities, services, and programs sponsored by this school, agree that this compact outlines our responsibilities for student achievement and our dedication to a community partnership so children achieve the state's high standards.

School Responsibilities

Ogle Elementary supports student learning and achievement by:

1. Providing high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment to enable children to meet the state's student academic achievement standards.
2. Holding parent-teacher conferences (at least annually) to ensure the individual child's achievement.
3. Providing parents with frequent reports on their child's progress with progress reports and curriculum updates using grade level websites, and in phone conversations, emails, conferences, etc.
4. Providing parents reasonable access to staff by providing regular, weekly conference hours and email and telephone contact information.
5. Providing parents opportunities to volunteer and to observe/participate during the school day through activities including a scheduled class observation time upon request; Mystery Reader; chaperone for Study Trips; PTA school-related activities (ex. WatchDogs, Ogle Read2Run, class parties, grade-specific scheduled activities, etc.).

Parent Responsibilities

We, as parents, support our child's learning in the following ways:

1. Monitor attendance.
2. Ensure homework is complete.
3. Attend scheduled school activities (Ex. Parent-conference day, Curriculum Night, Open House, etc.).
4. Participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to my child's education.
5. Stay informed about my child's education and communicating with the school by promptly reading all notices from the school or the school district either received by my child, by mail, or by email, and responding, as appropriate.

Student Responsibilities
