STEPS TO COLLEGE ADMISSIONS


What can I do *this summer* in preparation for college applications?

- Narrow your college search, note deadlines and check college admission criteria
- Visit colleges
- Complete a resume
- Practice for SAT and ACT if you plan to test again in the fall –
 - Method Test Prep on Family Connection under ACT/SAT Practice
 - College Board at www.collegeboard.org
 - The Princeton Review prep classes offered to Frisco ISD students
- Determine which teachers you will ask to write your recommendation letters
- Begin drafting your application essays

Topic A: REQUIRED

What was the environment in which you were raised? Describe your family, home, neighborhood, or community, and explain how it has shaped you as a person.

Topic B: REQUIRED

Most students have an identity, an interest, or a talent that defines them in an essential way. Tell us about yourself.

<u>Topic C:</u> Optional


You've got a ticket in your hand -- Where will you go? What will you do? What will happen when you get there?



Common Application Essay prompts: College Application Essay

- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from *obstacles we encounter* can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a *challenge*, *setback*, *or failure*. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you *questioned* or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your *thinking*? What was the outcome?
- 4. Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve. It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma anything that is of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution.
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?

EARLY ACTION / EARLY DECISION

Early Action

Regular Decision

- Some select schools offer early action or early decision.
- These schools often have deadlines of November 1st or earlier.
- Early Action *is not* binding. You just find out early if you are admitted.
- **Early Decision** <u>is</u> binding. If you get accepted, you <u>must withdraw</u> all other applications and attend the school.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE APPLICANTS

• If planning to attend a two-year college, you will apply online in February.



- Open enrollment
- SAT/ACT <u>is not</u> required for two-year colleges; however, you must still meet the TSI requirements
