The following information is intended to guide you in the enrollment and registration process to attend Centennial High School. Please make sure to provide each required document and complete the online registration form to ensure your enrollment appointment can be made. Once all documentation is received, you will be contacted for an appointment during the schedule listed below.

During the 30-minute enrollment appointments, you and your student will visit with a CHS counselor regarding course selection and information relevant to getting started at Centennial High School. We ask that students and parents review the registration materials on our website *prior to the enrollment appointment*...especially the appropriate grade-level **registration video** and the **course catalog**: <http://bit.ly/2iWs75A>.

It is very important that the student attend the meeting, as this is the only opportunity to meet with a counselor for scheduling purposes.

REGISTRATION DATES: (subject to change)

May 15-18: 9 a.m. -11 a.m – for families with established residency in the Centennial zone, but are finishing the school year elsewhere

July 31-August 4: 9 a.m. - 11 a.m.; 1 p.m. - 3:30 p.m.

August 10: 1 p.m. - 3:30 p.m.

August 11: 9 a.m. - 11 a.m.

August 14-16, 18: Times to be determined

2017-2018 New to Frisco ISD Student Registration

To schedule an appointment you must **FIRST** complete the online registration: <http://bit.ly/2nc0R5n>.

Then, fill out the form on the link below and upload the following documents:

- Birth Certificate
- Social Security Card
- Immunization records
- Unofficial Transcript (final report card for incoming freshman)
- Proof of Residency (water, gas or electric bill)

If you have not received a utility bill yet, a signed lease or contract/closing papers on a home purchase will suffice. A utility bill is required within 30 days of move-in.

You will be contacted in late July for a 30-minute enrollment appointment, during the listed times on the previous page.

If you are coming from out of the country, the following is required:

All required documents must be in English, or translated by the government of home country or a certified translation agency in the United States. Personal translations are not accepted. In addition, a letter must be included from the principal/headmaster on school letterhead showing the enrollment and withdrawal dates of the student as well as the school year calendar and an assurance that the student has not completed the graduation requirements from that school.

If a language other than English is spoken most of the time in your home and by your child, an oral language proficiency test will be administered as soon as possible to determine your student's eligibility for the appropriate language program.
