
PSAT Day - October 11th

HOW MANY CREDITS DO YOU NEED TO GRADUATE?



How do I receive credits??



Credits are awarded for passed classes at the end of every semester. For example:

English I = 1^{st} semester, 80 = .5+ English I = 2^{nd} semester, 72 = .51.0

WHAT HAPPENS IF I **PASS ONE SEMESTER AND FAIL ANOTHER SEMESTER?**

Example:

English I – 1st semester: 65 English I – 2nd semester: 75

*Average 1^{st} sem and 2^{nd} sem: 65+75 = 140/2 = 70 = 1.0 credit

However, failed semester classes go into your GPA as a ZERO, even if you average pass.

What is your GPA?

GPA IS YOUR GRADE POINT AVERAGE. S USED TO CLA RANK IN CLASS. IT IS ETERMINER AFTER EACH SEMESTER.

HOW DO I FIGURE MY GPA?

Grade Points are given based on whether your classes are: AP/PAP (6.0 scale) Regular (5.0 scale) Dual Credit (5.5 scale)

See chart in your Academic Catalog or ask your Teacher/Counselor

Examples of calculating grade points...

 1^{st} semester grades:English I85 = 3.5 grade pts.Algebra I80 = 3.0 grade pts.Biology70 = 2.0 grade pts.World Geo93 = 4.3 grade pts.

Add all grade pts. 3.5+3.0+2.0+4.3 = 12.8Divide total grade pts. By the number of courses 12.8/4 = 3.2 Grade point average

Another example using Pre-AP classes

 1^{st} semester gradesPAP English I85 = 4.5 grade pts.Algebra I80 = 3.0 grade pts.PAP Biology70 = 3.0 grade pts.PAP World Geo93 = 5.3 grade pts.

Add all grade pts. 4.5+3.0+3.0+5.3 = 15.8Divide total grade points by number of classes 15.8/4 = 3.95 grade point average

WHY IS YOUR GPA IMPORTANT?

The top 10% of the class have automatic admission to Texas **PUBLIC** Universities. **UT-Austin is currently**

What do colleges look for in their applicants?

- They look at GPA and RANK, but they also look at:
 - Courses taken
 - Activities inside /outside of school
 - Hobbies/interests
 - What makes <u>YOU</u> stand out from all other applicants??????
 - Start <u>NOW</u> with getting involved in clubs/organizations and get connected!!!!!

Advice for 9th graders

• Get connected!

- Join a club or an organization
- Look at the Organization wall across from the Counseling Office for Flyers
- Get organized!!!
- Do you know how to study?
- Do not procrastinate!!!
- Utilize tutoring (before and after school / Flex Time)
- Communicate with your teachers.
- ▶ Time management/ 24 hours in a day. ☺

What should I do if I'm struggling?

- Talk to your teachers and parents to identify what you need to work on.
- Try different organization techniquesplanner, HAC, homework folders
- Make time to review notes each night after class.
- Attend tutorials REGULARLY with SPECIFIC questions/topics for your teacher to explain.
- Don't give up. Classes are difficult, but with hard work, persistence and working WITH your teachers/parents, you CAN do it. Focus on your growth.

- It is your scorecard!
- It is how colleges/employers evaluate you.
- It is the official record of: semester grades and GPA/Rank

Grade Classification At the end of this year:

A student who has earned a total of 6 credits or more will be classified as a sophomore.

It is important to pass your classes so you can graduate on time!
