# Alma Hernandez:

Thirteen years ago, a college degree was a dream to current Frisco High School ESOL teacher Alma Hernandez. Good grades, hard work, a support system, and a couple of scholarships from the Frisco Education Foundation helped make her dream a reality. Mrs. Hernandez, a 2000 Frisco High graduate, focused on her extracurricular activities such as Color Guard, Choir, Spanish Club, and participated in Shattered Dreams. On scholarship night, she was awarded two Frisco Education Foundation Scholarships. After high school she attended Collin County Community College for two years, but then dropped out of school

due to the lack of funds. However, she refused to quit on her dream. She applied for a position as an aide as another way of becoming an ESL teacher. She first worked at Centennial High School and then, at Staley Middle School. While working as a teacher aide, she also enrolled herself back into college and worked twice as hard to reach her dream, she said being a teacher's aide "helped her tremendously." Mrs. Hernandez still continued working in the district, while attending Texas Woman's University, and she was hired in 2012 to teach at her alma mater. **Applications for Frisco Education** Foundation scholarships are being

accepted by the Foundation until 5 p.m. December 20. In 2013, the foundation awarded more than 700 FISD students more than \$600,000 in scholarships.
