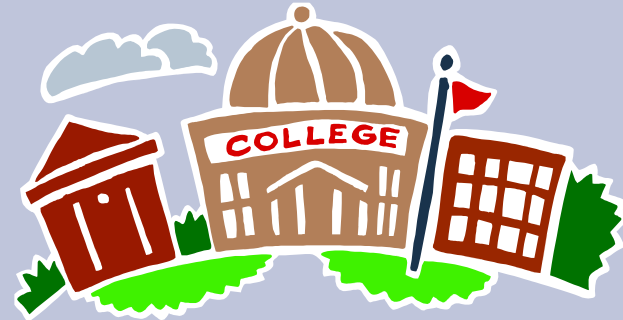

What is dual credit?



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- You earn high school and college credit for the same course!
 - Courses taught by Collin College professor at your HS or on a Collin campus
 - Begin a college transcript – transfer options

 - Please check with private and out-of-state institutions

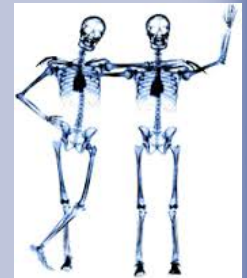

Dual Credit Eligibility

- Students complete the **entire** admissions process plus a permission form for registration at Collin College
- Available with permission from your high school each semester for every course
- Must meet college readiness standards as defined by Texas Success Initiative (TSI) (more details to follow)
- Students must earn a C or better in each course to maintain participation in the program

Things to consider...

- **HS and Collin calendar may be different**
 - You follow the Collin calendar
 - Holidays may vary
 - Collin College may hold classes at the high school if the high school building is open, even when high schools are not in session (ex: teacher work day)
 - If the high school site is not available, professors may make arrangements for online assignment or hold class at Collin campus
 - Weather closings--if the location where your class is held closes, you do not have class



Things to consider...

- **FERPA** and Personal Responsibility
 - Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
 - Federal law that ensures privacy of student educational records (begins when student starts college regardless of age)
 - Collin cannot share grades, course schedules, test scores, etc. with parents
 - Students' opportunity to gain new responsibilities and act on his/her own behalf

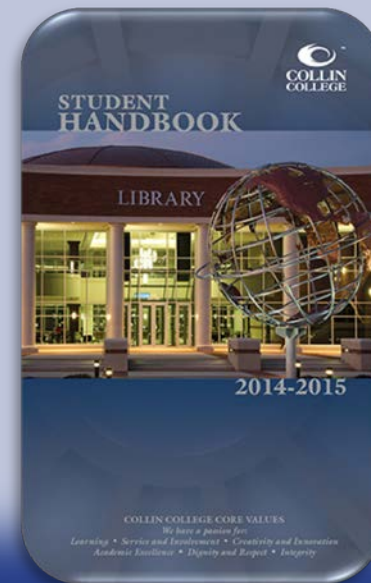
Things to consider...

- **Collin College deadlines for Drop/Withdraw**
 - Listed in Collin College registration guide
 - **Drop** is before the term's census date and will not appear on college transcript
 - **Withdraw** is after term's census date and will appear as "W" on college transcript, does not affect GPA
 - Must complete paperwork on Collin campus
 - Impact on graduation
 - Discuss with your HS counselor



Things to consider...

- **Collin College Student Handbook**
 - You are a college student!
 - Abide by all policies, procedures and decisions of the college as outlined in the current *Student Handbook* (available online)
 - Dean of Students
 - Plagiarism/Discipline

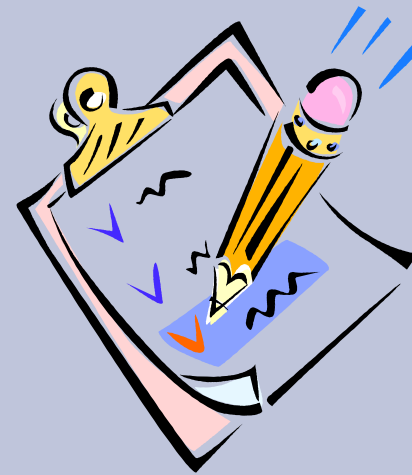

1. Application for Admission

WHEN do I apply?

- You may apply online beginning **NOW** for Fall 2015!
- Must be complete before anything else can occur at Collin.

HOW?

- Complete online with the Texas Common Application at ***ApplyTexas.org***



Questions on ApplyTexas.org

- Create an account/profile and then an application
- Select two year college application and Collin County Community College District
- Answer YES to “will you be taking courses prior to high school graduation?”
- Select anything for “Major”
- List your SSN if possible
- For “Admissions Basis” select Dual Credit
- Residency/tuition is decided based on your answers on the application and the documentation you provide

3. Official High School Transcript

- Collin needs the most recent high school transcript for every student.
 - Does not have to include final spring grades
- May include test scores for TSI exemptions/waivers.
- May include vaccine records.
- Follow your high school's specific steps to request one.

4. Bacterial Meningitis Vaccination

- State Law (SB 1107) requires all students under the age of 22 entering a higher education institution to provide proof of having the vaccine or document an exception or exemption.
- This is an admissions requirement for Collin College and should be completed before registration.
- May sign Request for Exception if taking courses on HS campus only (purple form in packet).

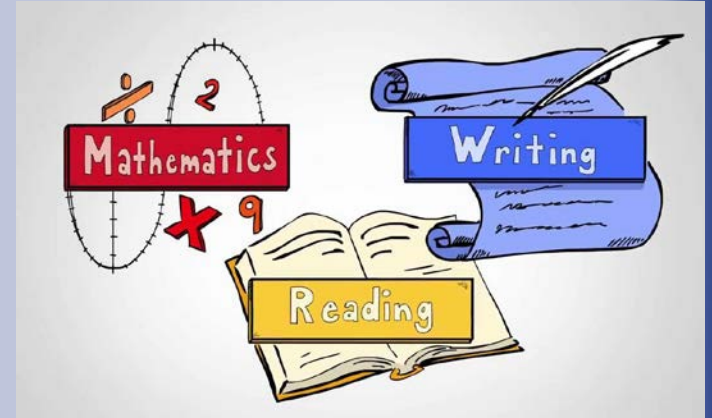

- ACT/SAT scores must be sent from the testing source directly to Collin College if not provided on your HS transcript
- STAAR scores will be on your high school transcript if applicable

Texas Success Initiative (TSI)

- The TSI is designed to measure competency in **reading, writing, and mathematics**. Students need a status in all subject areas.
- It is used for placement purposes.
- Students must be at college level in reading and writing for the majority of courses.
- Most math and some science and technical courses require college level in math.
- See the college catalog for placement and prerequisite information.



TSI: What will I need to do?

- Complete Pre-Assessment Activity (PAA) online and print certificate of completion (a link to the PAA will be emailed to you at the time of admission)
- Print testing referral emailed to you at the time of admission or obtain a testing referral from Admissions and Records or Academic Advising with a photo ID.
- Pay the cashier, cost is \$29.
- Walk in to test with any campus Testing Center. You should bring your testing referral, receipt, a picture ID, and PAA certificate of completion.
- See an Academic Advisor to review your results.

What if my TSI scores are low?

TSI Minimum Score Requirements		
Reading	Writing	Math
351	Essay score of 5 or Essay score of 4 and multiple choice of 363	350


- You only need college level placement in the areas needed for your course (e.g. ENGL 1301 requires college level in reading and writing but not in math)
- Mandatory Advising (MA) hold
 - Will be on your account if you place below college level in at least one area
- If you do not place at “college level” in the areas required for your course that means you need to focus on your high school work at this time.

COLLIN COLLEGE **Concurrent/Dual Credit Enrollment Procedure**
Students must act on their own behalf. Photo ID is required for all transactions for the program apply; please consult the Concurrent/Dual Credit Enrollment Procedure at www.collin.edu/dualcredit.

The following steps must be completed sequentially.

- 1. Application**
 - Apply to Collin College online at ApplyTexas.org at least two weeks prior to registration (be sure to complete the profile and application).
 - You will receive an email from admissions@collin.edu when your application has been received (this could take a week or longer during peak periods). It will provide your Cart and list items you need to turn in.
- 2. Concurrent Enrollment Permission Form** (returning students pre-approved for concurrent enrollment)
 - You must have a completed concurrent enrollment permission form on file with your HS counselor for approval and to pick up the form.
 - Your high school may provide directly to Collin College if you return it to them at the end of the school year. You may also provide it to Admissions and Records or a Special Services Coordinator/Advisor.
 - The form must be signed by a high school official (most commonly high school principal/guardian must also sign if student is under 18). In addition, a principal or administrator must also sign if the student is approved for an overload.
- 3. Official High School Transcript**
 - Students are responsible for providing an official high school transcript to Collin College. Please visit with your HS counselor for approval and to pick up the transcript.
 - The transcript may include test scores that qualify you for a TSI exemption or waiver. Students may need to request official scores from the high school.
- 4. Bacterial Meningitis Vaccine**
 - Submit proof of vaccine or exception form if taking classes on a HS campus or at a testing center. Please visit with your HS counselor for approval and to pick up the form.
 - Other exceptions and exemptions are available. Please visit www.collin.edu/menigitis for more information.
 - When steps 1-4 are complete, you will receive another email from admissions@collin.edu providing your log-in information for CougarWeb.
- 5. Texas Success Initiative (TSI) Assessment**
 - All students must test or prove an exemption/waiver. If you believe you have a TSI exemption/waiver, please provide official scores and see Admissions and Records. See back for more information.
 - To complete testing at any Collin Testing Center, you must:

All home school students must provide a letter of school standing and a letter from the parent/guardian with a Special Admissions form, completing step 5.

6. Register for Courses Online

- Go to Add or Drop Classes once logged into **CougarWeb**
 - Select **Fall 2015 Credit** term
 - enter your specific CRN for your designated course as listed on your high school course sheet
- Use Look Up Classes to enroll in general population courses on a Collin campus
- Detailed instructions can be found on your high school course sheet

Enrollment Verification

- Must enroll in the subjects on your permission form
- Prefer another subject? Turn in a new form!
- Limitations:
 - No more than two courses per semester
 - Principal approval required for three or more
 - No 3 week May, PHED, or developmental level courses

Fall 2015 Important Dates

- You can apply online at ApplyTexas.org beginning now!
- Registration is June 2nd through July 29th online.
- Registration should be complete by Wednesday, July 29th at 8 p.m.
- Fall semester is August 24th – December 13th

7. Pay Tuition

- \$39 per credit hour for students residing in Collin County
 - \$119 for a 3 credit hr course
- \$78 per credit hour for students residing out of Collin County
 - \$236 for a 3 credit hr course
- \$138 per credit hour for out of state or out of country students
 - \$416 for a 3 credit hr course
- Tuition waived for students qualifying for free or reduced lunch at the high school

*Total cost per 3 credit hour course includes a \$2 per semester student records fee

*All fees subject to change upon approval of the Collin Board of Trustees.



8. Get Books

- You have to buy books in college!
- You can find out which books you need by going online to the bookstore's web site a couple of weeks before the semester begins.
 - Select Preston Ridge Campus and search for your specific course section (e.g. ENGL 1301 F01)



Dual Credit and Concurrent Credit for High School/Home School Students

What is Dual Credit?
High School students can take Collin College courses and receive credit both for their high school diploma and their college degree. Courses may be taught on the high school or college campus by Collin College professors.

What is Concurrent Credit?
This is when a student earns college credit only for a college course taught on the college campus.

High School/Home School Official approval is required for both dual and concurrent credit.

College credit will transfer to most colleges or universities. Please visit Collin's [TransferU](#) for more information.

Who can participate?
Students enrolled in a public high school, private, charter or home school who have at least junior year high school standing can participate. Students must also have permission from the appropriate high school officials, an A/B grade point average, meet Texas Success Initiative standards and demonstrate the maturity level needed to be successful in college course work.

Enrollment Procedures and Requirements
Students complete the entire admissions, testing, and registration process at Collin College. A photo ID is required for all transactions on campus. Start the process by visiting with your high school counselor to discuss eligibility and class schedule. After meeting with your counselor you can:
