SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

1. 2017 ROTARY CLUB SCHOLARSHIP

This year the Rotary Club of Frisco will award a \$6,000.00 scholarship to two Frisco ISD graduating seniors. The scholarship awards are based on need, academic achievement, leadership, and participation in extra-curricular activities.

The completed scholarship application along with an official transcript must be mailed and postmarked no later than Thursday, March 22, 2018 to:
The Rotary Club of Frisco

Frisco, TX 75034

After review of the applications and interviews with applicants, the Rotary Scholarship Committee will determine the recipient and present the award at a monthly Rotary meeting. The Rotary Treasurer will issue a check for \$750.00 each semester of a reward recipient's attendance at junior college, college, or university for up to eight (8) semesters. The check will be made out to the junior college, college, or university of the student's choice with instructions for the funds to be applied to the reward recipient's account.

General Requirements:

- 1. The college or university must be a Southern Association or state accredited college, junior college, or university.
- 2. The recipient must be a full-time student, defined by taking a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours.
- 3. Recipients are required to maintain a 2.5 average on a four (4) point system or a 1.75 average on a three (3) point system.
- 4. Beginning with the recipient student's second semester, ensuing scholarship payments will be contingent on the student's presenting to the Rotary scholarship chair a transcript showing the grade point average for that semester and proof of registration for the next semester.
- 5. Recipients are asked to visit the Rotary Club of Frisco at least once each year and report on their progress of studies.
- 6. If the recipient drops out of school for two (2) consecutive semesters, their scholarship will be forfeited.
- 7. Students whose parent is a member of Rotary International are not eligible for this scholarship.

MAKE UPDATES TO YOUR FOUR-YEAR PLAN THROUGH HOME ACCESS CENTER (HAC)

Monday, November 27th through Friday, January 12

The FHS Counselors encourage you to take time now to investigate course options available to you by using the <u>FISD Course Guide</u>. Many courses require pre-requites, so planning ahead can help to insure you are able to take the classes you want by the time you graduate.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

1. This is an activity that you need to complete mostly on your own. Counselors will meet individually with students in February in order to confirm/discuss course selections for the 2018-2019 school year. You may email your counselor or stop by the Counseling Office if you have a specific question that is NOT answered in this email or in the Course Selection Resources button provided on the FHS Counselor Website.

Counselors will offer <u>two</u> Flex Friday meetings to assist students updating their four-year plan on HAC. <u>December 8th and January 12th during Flextime in the Lecture Hall</u>. Chrome books will be provided.

- 2. See Updating Your Four-Year Plan for directions on how to update your plan in HAC.
- 3. If you are unable to find a certain class, it may be due to a grade restriction. Dual Credit courses, Aide positions and Late Arrival/Early Release will not show up for selection in Career Plan. You will be able to change courses not listed in Career Plan when you meet with your counselor individually in February.
- **Keep in mind this is not mandatory, but is an opportunity for those who would like to make changes now. This will also insure that your Course Verification sheet that is given out in January through Social Studies classes is accurate.**

Fall 2018 Freshman Application Deadlines Approach

As December 1 nears, here's some helpful information for you and your students about MyStatus, deadline specifics (including a reminder for students affected by Hurricane Harvey), Document Upload for application items, email and text reminders going to students, and extended hours and assistance from UT Austin.

3 – COLORADO STATE UNIVERSITY

We know this is the season for application deadlines, and each one can operate a little differently.

Here's an overview of our **December 1 Early Action** date to help guide your conversations with students.



December 1 Early Action is not a deadline.

About 60% of freshmen will apply by December 1.

It is a **recommended application date**. In fact, to allow for postmark and processing of support documents, any student whose application is complete by **December 8** is "on time" for Early Action consideration.

WHAT'S REQUIRED



Early Action decisions are made in 2-3 weeks.

Our goal is to send out Early Action decisions before winter break.

Early Action applicants receive full admission review and automatic consideration for admissions-based scholarships.

FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Early Action provides early access.

Early Action and Regular Decision selection criteria are the same. Early Action applicants have more choice and breathing room for their next steps.

Students admitted now gain early access to financial aid (in December), and deposited students can sign up first for housing (in November) and orientation (in January). In addition, high achieving students can turn their attention to applications for other scholarships and for the Honors Program, which expects to fill by February.

STEPS FOR ADMITTED FRESHMEN



Early Action is non-binding.

Students have until May 1 to deposit and secure their place at CSU.

We know financial fit will be an important deciding factor for many students and families, so we're regularly communicating about the four factors of financial fit and our net-price calculator to give families the tools they need in the decision process.



Early Action is open to everyone.

Every school has an assigned admissions representative available to answer questions, and we have a team of campus-based counselors who field questions from any area by phone and by email.

All students are eligible for Early Action consideration. If we need additional information before making a decision, we'll ask for it. Students are invited to contact their admissions counselor if they have questions about their credentials.

Upcoming KU Deadlines and Reminders

Upcoming Deadlines

- KU's FAFSA priority date is Dec. 1 encourage admitted students to file the FAFSA if they have not already. They can continue to apply after this date.
- For students interested in the Legal Education Accelerated Degree program (LEAD), encourage them to apply by the Dec. 1 priority date, law.ku.edu/lead.
- The Multicultural Scholars Program is taking applications, <u>msp.ku.edu</u>. Their first priority date to apply is January 2 and the final deadline to apply is Feb. 1, 2018.
- The Business Leadership Program's first application deadline is Dec. 1. Students must be freshmen business admits, have a 28 ACT or higher (with 26 math ACT or higher) and a 3.5 GPA or higher to apply. Details can be found at https://business.ku.edu/business-leadership/overview
- The first deadline to apply for the scholarship hall was Nov. 1 and the next deadline is March
