SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

1. THE WELDON HALL IR.

Deadline: January 15th

Eligibility - A recipient must:

- 1) Be an entering freshman student at Sam Houston State University majoring in Art.
- 2) Submit a complete Scholarship Packet to SHSU Art Department by the specified deadline. Performing arts majors not eligible.

The Weldon Hall Jr. Endowment in Art was established in 2004 in honor of Weldon Hall Jr.

Recipients of this award must be entering freshman at Sam Houston State University majoring in Art. Applicants must submit a portfolio of work as describe below.

Scholarship Packet:

All materials must be submitted in a single packet at one time. A completed Scholarship Packet will include the following items:

- 1) Completed and signed Weldon Hall Jr. Scholarship Application Form Portfolio of 8 to 12 works, 2-D or 3-D, including at least 3 drawings. Work must be submitted as JPGs on CD or thumb-drive. Do not submit actual works.
- Image list, indicating media, size, and date of completion. Artist's Statement no longer than one typewritten page. (Explain what the work is about and describe why you want to come to SHSU)
- 3) Self-addressed, stamped envelope for return of materials.

Incomplete scholarship packets will not be considered.

All necessary materials must be postmarked or received on or before the stated dateline.

Selection Criteria:

Applicants will be evaluated based on originality, level of technical proficiency, and emergence of personal style or vision. At the conclusion of the selection process, applicants will be notified by mail. Notification will be given before Sam Houston State University's general application deadline.

Requirements

The Business Leaders of Tomorrow Scholarship is offered to students entering or currently pursuing an educational program related to business or finance. Students must be at least 17 years of age and have a GPA of 3.0 or higher.

All applicants must submit a 600 to 1,000-word essay explaining what they hope to accomplish during their career in a business or finance field and how the scholarship would fulfill those goals. Recommended topics are included in the Personal Essay section.

All applications must be received by January 29th, 2017. Finalists will be notified in February and must provide proof of enrollment and GPA (letters of acceptance, transcripts, etc.) before the scholarship recipient is selected.

Selection

Applications will be reviewed by a panel. The winner will be selected based on the criteria set forth in the requirements section of this document.

Once the winner is decided and notified of the award, he/she will receive a mailed 1099-MISC tax form and the check will be delivered to their address. The winner of the scholarship award will be fully responsible for the taxes incurred from receiving the award.

The completed scholarship application along with an official transcript must be mailed and postmarked no later than Thursday, March 16, 2017 to:

After review of the applications and interviews with applicants, the Rotary Scholarship Committee will determine the recipient and present the award at a monthly Rotary meeting.

The Rotary Treasurer will issue a check for \$750.00 each semester of a reward recipient's attendance at junior college, college, or university for up to eight (8) semesters. The check will be made out to the junior college, college, or university of the student's choice with instructions for the funds to be applied to the reward recipient's account.

General Requirements:

- The college or university must be a Southern Association or state accredited college, junior college, or university.
- The recipient must be a full-time student, defined by taking a minimum of twelve (12) semester hours.
- Recipients are required to maintain a 2.5 average on a four (4) point system or a 1.75 average on a three (3) point system.
- 4. Beginning with the recipient student's second semester, ensuing scholarship payments will be contingent on the student's presenting to the Rotary scholarship chair a transcript showing the grade point average for that semester and proof of registration for the next semester.
- Recipients are required to visit the Rotary Club of Frisco at least once each year and report on their progress of studies.
- If the recipient drops out of school for two (2) consecutive semesters, their scholarship will be forfeited.
- Students whose parent is a member of Rotary International are <u>not</u> eligible for this scholarship.


