Eligibility To be eligible for a new scholarship, all four (4) of the following requirements must be met: 1. The student must have an unweighted academic average of "B" or better (3.0 on a 4.0 scale). 2. The student must be a graduating high school senior who intends to enroll the next semester following high school graduation in an accredited college or university. 3. The student must plan to major in business, one of the physical sciences, technology, engineering or mathematic fields in preparation for a career in the energy sector. 4. The student must be one of the historically underrepresented minorities in the sciences, technology, engineering and math related disciplines. (African American, Hispanic or Native American) The American Council of the Blind has a great opportunity for students who are legally blind to earn a scholarship, whether you are going to a technical college, an entering freshman, undergraduate or a graduate student. Over \$45,000 in scholarships are awarded to students each year. To be eligible, you need to be legally blind in both eyes, maintain a 3.0 GPA, and be involved in your school/local community. Applicant must be resident of Texas and a child or grandchild of a veteran who served in WWI, WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Lebanon, Grenada, Panama, or the Persian Gulf. Eligibility is based upon actual need, goals, objectives, character, citizenship, and war service of father or mother. INFORMATION ABOUT THE EVENT:

Audition Requirements:

Acting Audition Requirements: Please prepare two contemporary, contrasting 60-90 second monologues from a published contemporary English language play or screenplay.

Musical Theatre Audition Requirements: Please prepare two contrasting musical theatre songs with musical accompaniment on a USB, personal musical player (e.g. iPhone), and one 60-90 second monologue from a published contemporary English language play or screenplay.

I would encourage only seniors to audition as this event as this will be for enrollment next year. Students must have a headshot and updated resume. Please have 3 copies at least to hand out. Students need to understand this will be their official audition for NYFA. Stress to your students the importance of coming prepared as they will be looked at for acceptance and financial aid to NYFA. Students must dress professional.

Portfolio Reviews for Degree Programs: (i.e. Filmmaking, Screenwriting, Photography, Game Design, Animation.....)

Creative samples can be accepted in various stages of development, or as completed work. Examples of work can range from drawings, conceptual illustrations, short films, poetry, short stories, storyboards, designs, photographs, three-dimensional models, or digitally generated images. Students may choose to submit a typed screenplay or short story (10 page maximum). Please stress to students to come fully prepared and many examples of their work to show head of admissions. This will be their official interview to NYFA and will be looked at for acceptance and financial aid. Students must dress profession.

Information Session:

You and a parent/guardian can attend a 30 minute presentation about NYFA. This is an opportunity to learn everything there is to know about NYFA. Afterwards, we will open the floor to Q&A where parents can answer questions about the college. Please reach out to me directly if you wish to attend the event and how many will attend with you.

1 – JEWISH FAMILY SERVICE OF GREATER DALLAS - INTERNSHIP PROGRAM



The Jewish Family Service of Greater Dallas has an exciting opportunity for students in the community.

JFS is currently seeking High School sophomores, juniors, and seniors ages 16 to 18 years old who are interested in interning with a Dallas area non-profit during the Summer of 2018. The Klein Summer Internship Program provides the opportunity for local High School students to learn about non-profit agencies through hands-on experience and invaluable training. This program helps teens to actualize the concept of social justice while developing their personal communication and work place skills. Ideally, students will deepen their understanding of the unique needs of the clients served by each organization and learn about the importance of direct service, philanthropy, advocacy, and community organizing as they prepare for future jobs in the nonprofit sector or simply connecting to volunteer opportunities in their future.

Interns will be chosen through a competitive process involving a written application and an inperson interview here at JFS. Then, students will be matched with non-profit organizations through a mutual selection process. At the end of the summer, each intern will receive a certificate reflecting their participation and completion of 180 hours of service to the Dallas community. Often, they will also receive written recommendations from their supervisor and, if appropriate, JFS staff.
