5. WOMEN'S TRANSPORTATION SEMINAR - 2017 HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

WTS: Advancing Women In Transportation is an international organization with over 5,000 members and 46 chapters. WTS is committed to excellence in the transportation industry and provides an opportunity for member career advancement through the exchange of information, ideas and experiences. WTS' network provides professional support to its members through a variety of services, including career development assistance, seminars on current transportation issues, and regular newsletters.

WTS has created a new Transportation YOU scholarship for high school seniors in the amount of \$2,500. All applications must be sent through a local chapter. The Greater Dallas/Fort Worth chapter accepts applications from students attending an eligible high school (see listing in application form) in Texas and Oklahoma. These scholarships have been made possible through generous contributions from our corporate members. Every year, the scholarships are competitive and based on the applicant's specific transportation involvement and goals, job skills and academic record. Minority candidates are encouraged to apply. Past applicants have had interest in pursuing careers in civil, mechanical, aerospace, electrical, and environmental engineering, as well as urban planning, public policy, public safety, and emergency response. Please encourage your students to apply for these scholarships.

For this year only, the Greater Dallas/Fort Worth chapter of WTS, working with Gorrondona & Associates, Inc., has created a separate \$2,500 scholarship for female high school seniors (different eligibility than Transportation YOU – Dallas/Fort Worth region only, see listing in application form), with minimum of two such scholarships being awarded in fall 2017. The Gorrondona & Associates, Inc./WTS High School Scholarship was founded in 2015 with the goal of encouraging female high school seniors to pursue STEM studies at the community college or university level. These scholarships are targeted towards Dallas/Fort Worth area students with a financial need, who are among the first of their family members to attend college, are working to contribute to a family budget or participating in activities outside of schoolwork, and wish to pursue a career in the transportation field. There is no corresponding WTS Foundation Scholarship for this local award.

All over the world, local WTS chapter scholarship winners become eligible for a corresponding scholarship at the WTS Foundation level. In addition to the Transportation YOU High School scholarship, WTS offers two scholarships for graduate students, two scholarships for undergraduate students studying at universities, and one scholarship for community college/trade/technical school students. The local and national scholarships are based on the same criteria in order to maximize the possibility that the applicant can also win the WTS Foundation scholarship award. Thus, applicants should complete the enclosed application to be eligible for both local and national awards.

Your school/district may have several deserving young women who are eligible for this scholarship and we are asking for your assistance in making the application form available to them. Please encourage any young women meeting the minimum criteria to apply. The application is simple and straightforward and may be downloaded from

http://www.wtsinternational.org/greaterdallas/scholarships. The application form and accompanying transcript, personal statement, and letter(s) of recommendation must be post marked no later than Friday, October 27, 2017, in order to be eligible for the scholarships. We expect to notify the women selected in December 2017.

Students should record their reading of the draft to an audio CD or flash drive. The recording can be no shorter than three minutes and no longer than five minutes (plus or minus five seconds).

Entries begin at the Post level. Once the student creates their essay and completes burning the audio version to an audio CD/flash drive, they can submit their typed version, CD/flash drive and the Voice of Democracy entry form to their local participating VFW Post by the November 1 deadline.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

* Originality is worth 30 points: Treatment of the theme should show imagination and human interest.

* Content is worth 35 points: Clearly express your ideas in an organized manner. Fully develop your theme and use transitions to move smoothly from one idea to the other.

* Delivery is worth 35 points: Speak in a clear and credible manner.

Distinguished Scholarship Invitational at Wichita State University

This is a very prestigious scholarship competition for up to \$60,000 based off of leadership and academics and will be awarded to three high school seniors this year! Competition day: Saturday, November 18, 2017


Students must meet only ONE of the following criteria to be eligible to compete:

- · Have a minimum unweighted 3.5 GPA, or
- Have a minimum ACT composite score of 27, or
- · Have a minimum SAT composite score of 1280, or
- · Rank in the top 10% of the student's graduating class at the end of their junior year

Additional criteria for a student to compete: Must be a 2018 high school graduate, must *submit their WSU application materials by October 15, 2017 and submit the scholarship competition application by November 1, 2017*.

8. EARLE NORTH PARKER ESSAY CONTEST



The Seidel Chapter – Dallas Air Force Association is proud once again to announce that the Air Force Association - Texas will sponsor an essay contest with the statewide winners receiving a total of \$3,000

in awards. The awards are given in honor of Earle North Parker, a noted industrialist and community leader of Fort Worth.

The Air Force Association is an independent, non-profit national association, which was established at the end of World War II. Its primary objective is to support an armed strength adequate to maintain the security and peace of the United States and the Free World.

The essay topic for this year's contest is, "Non-commissioned pilots: Historically, who did, and now who does/could pilot Air Force aircraft?". ALL high school seniors in Texas are eligible to participate in this essay contest. Each essay shall be limited to a minimum of 500 words and a maximum of 600 words. Please read the entire Contest Entry Form attachment before starting work on the essay. Deadline for submission of the essay, accompanied by the completed Contest Entry Form, is January 20, 2018.

After all entries are received, the Seidel Chapter will select our Chapter winner, who will receive a \$500 award. Our winning entry will then be forwarded to our Texas State Office where the winning entry from each of the Air Force Association Chapters across the state will compete for \$3,000 in scholarship awards. The two scholarships are \$2,000 for 1st Place and \$1,000 for 2nd Place. The winners will be determined and announced this spring.


