1. MIDWESTERN STATE UNIVERSITY - SCHOLARSHIPS

New Scholarship Program for First Generation College Students

MSU and the Priddy Foundation have partnered together to offer scholarships for outstanding students who are the first in their immediate family to attend a four-year university, in addition to supporting students throughout their four years of education at Midwestern State University. Scholarships are selective and cover tuition, fees, books, room & board, as well as a study abroad experience! OKCU offers special scholarship opportunities for incoming freshmen interested in studying business. <u>The Meinders Business Leadership Fellows Program</u> provides full-tuition scholarships and cocurricular activities for high-achieving, first-time freshmen. <u>The Business Excellence Award</u> (listed under OKCU Special Scholarships) is also a new scholarship program and is awarded at the time of admission to those who qualify.

3. APIASF - SCHOLARSHIPS FOR YOUR ASIAN AND PACIFIC ISLANDER STUDENTS

Don't let financial need get in the way of your students' college aspirations.

Financial need should never limit a student's ambitions.

The Asian & Pacific Islander American Scholarship Fund (APIASF) General Scholarship Program awarded over \$1.6 million in scholarships in 2017. Over half (58 percent) of the recipients had taken the PSAT/NMSQT® and were discovered through Student Search Service®.

APIASF offers scholarship opportunities for Asian American and Pacific Islander students with financial need to increase their access to higher education and resources that cultivate their academic, personal, and professional success.

The APIASF General Scholarship Program:

- Offers a range of scholarships from one-time \$2,500 awards to multiyear \$20,000 awards
- Offers awards that can be used to cover the total cost of attendance, not just tuition, room, and board
- Focuses on students who are representative of the Asian American and Pacific Islander community's geographic and ethnic diversity

The APIASF General Scholarship application opens on **September 14, 2017**.

The deadline to apply is January 11, 2018, at 5 p.m. ET.

4. THE WESLEYAN UNIVERSITY HAMILTON PRIZE FOR CREATIVITY SCHOLARSHIP

The Wesleyan University *Hamilton* Prize for Creativity is a four-year full-tuition scholarship established in honor of *Hamilton* writer and original star Lin-Manuel Miranda '02, Hon. '15 and director Thomas Kail '99. The story of our country's youngest founding father —a brash young immigrant who forever changed the course of history—*Hamilton* is an extraordinary artistic achievement: a multicultural hiphop opera that offers a profoundly original look at the birth of our nation. The Wesleyan University *Hamilton* Prize for Creativity is awarded to the incoming first-year student whose work of fiction, poetry, creative nonfiction or other creative written expression (lyrics, plays, scripts, etc.) best reflects the originality, artistry and dynamism embodied in *Hamilton*.

5. MONTANA UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

Frisco ISD utilizes ChooseToCare, an online and phone-based "tip-line" for students, parents, teachers and others to anonymously share any safety or health concern they may have regarding our schools and school community. It is another option for those with valuable information, who may have concerns or fears about using other established methods for communicating their information to school authorities.

Tip-lines have helped many organizations, public and private, to detect problems early on, minimizing harm and in many cases preventing it all together. When properly implemented, tip-lines serve to support a climate of safety, honesty and integrity within the organizations they serve.

ChooseToCare enables users to provide school officials with valuable information, securely, and from the privacy of their own homes. It is not meant to replace traditional and established methods of communication, but to supplement them. By providing another option for members of our school community (students, parents, administrators, teachers, etc.) to offer valuable information that they might otherwise choose to keep to themselves, ChooseToCare helps ensure that our schools will remain safe for all.


