# **SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES**

## **1- THE SANKOFA FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP**

The Sankofa Foundation is awarding three scholarships this year to graduating African American male seniors. Each student will be awarded an individual scholarship in the amount of \$1,000. The scholarship is payable to the student's college or university upon verification of enrollment as a full-time student at an accredited college or university. Box 743693 Dallas, TX 75374 by **February 8, 2019.** Awardees will be notified no later than April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. Selection Criteria:

1. Scholarships are limited to seniors attending public high schools in the DFW Area.

2. Preference is given to students who have demonstrated exceptional involvement and service to the community and who have greater needs given their socioeconomic background.

3. To be eligible for the scholarship, the student must be an African American Male and have a 3.0 grade point average or better on a 4.0 scale.

4. An eligible candidate must be a graduating high school senior.

5. An eligible candidate must be enrolling as a full-time student in a 2 or 4 year accredited college or university in the fall semester. Payment will be made directly to that school.

6. Students must complete the attached scholarship application including all required supporting materials

The awards are given in honor of Earle North Parker, a noted industrialist and community leader of Fort Worth.

The Air Force Association is an independent, non-profit national association, which was established at the end of World War II. Its primary objective is to support an armed strength adequate to maintain the security and peace of the United States and the Free World.

The essay topic for this year's contest is, **"How might the emerging technologies of Robotics and Artificial intelligence effect, both positive and negative, the operations of the United States Air Force?"** ALL high school seniors in Texas are eligible to participate in this essay contest. Each essay shall be limited to a maximum of two pages.
