

1- LIVING FOR ZACHARY ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP



Living for Zachary was founded in honor of Zachary Schrah, who was only 16 years old when he collapsed during a high school football practice in Plano on April 2, 2009. There was no warning. There were no signs. After Zachary's death, Living for Zachary, a non-profit organization, was established to raise awareness of SCA in youth.

Living for Zachary is dedicated to raising awareness of sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) in youth and saving lives through community education and awareness events, providing youth heart screenings, awarding student scholarships and donating automated external defibrillators (AEDs) to youth-based organizations.

Zachary Schrah planned to pursue a profession in the medical industry, and this scholarship honors his memory by supporting students pursuing post-secondary education in the medical profession.

The Living for Zachary Academic Scholarship will be awarded to three high school students in the amount of \$2,500 who demonstrate academic excellence, school and community participation, leadership potential and financial need.

- Demonstrate community service, volunteerism and commitment to leadership development
- Commit to pursue a medical oriented degree program
- · Demonstrate financial need

Background

All applications for the American College Foundation ("ACF") Visionary Scholarship Program will consist of: 1) a completed ACF Visionary Scholarship Application, 2) a copy of the student's most recent unofficial high school transcript, 3) a 500 word, typed, double-spaced essay. All components of the application must be received for a student to be eligible for an award. Applications are judged on the ability to follow guidelines (25%), grammar and punctuation (25%), and the merit of the written essay (50%). Applicants must be United States Citizens or Eligible Non-Citizens and may be asked to participate in a qualification interview as part of the application process to assist the ACF in ultimately determining the winners. Awards range from \$1,000 - \$5,000 each; with multiple winners to be selected. Each award is a non-renewable, one-time award and is to be used exclusively to offset costs and fees related directly to the student's first year of higher post-secondary education at an accredited institution of the student's choosing within the United States. Relatives of the American College Foundation Staff are NOT eligible to apply.


1- COLLEGE READINESS WORKSHOP - FREE

2- DEVELOP THE WHOLE CHILD



CURIOSITY:

wanting to learn more. Showing interest, seeking novelty, and being open to new experiences.

Students who demonstrate curiosity might be able to:

- Ask questions to deepen understanding;
- eagerly anticipate a new book, movie, or episode in a series they love;
- google to learn more about things that interest them;
- watch videos to learn a new skill;
- discuss a topic for no other reason than that it's interesting;
- articulate both an interest and the superordinate 'why' behind their interest.

Curiosity is about having an open and active mind. It's about exploration. Curiosity puts the brain in a state that makes learning easier, more enjoyable, and longer-lasting.

Teachers who demonstrate curiosity might:

- Read community news in order to develop more connections between content and context;
- seek professional development for both content knowledge and teaching skills;
- read about a discipline broadly, not just the specifics of a single course.

CURIOSITY

Guriosity isn't giving up on a new topic. It is accepting that the task is difficult and continuing to work to find a way to understand.

Ways to Practice

- Watching a video on how to cook new meal that your family has never tried;
- at dinner have each family member share one thing they learned that they never had thought about before.



Ways to Praise

Focus on "I notice . . . ' statements such as, "I noticed you researching topics other than just what you needed for your homework. I like that you are being curious about new things."


