## Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program (TASSP)

The purpose of the Texas Armed Services Scholarship Program is to encourage students to become members of the Texas Army National Guard, the Texas Air National Guard, the Texas State Guard, the United States Coast Guard, or the United States Merchant Marine, or to become commissioned officers in any branch of the armed services of the United States. Each year the governor and the lieutenant governor may each appoint two students, and each state senator and each state representative may appoint one student to receive an initial conditional scholarship award. Who Can Be Appointed?

Selected students must meet two of the following four academic criteria:

- Is on track to graduate or graduated high school with the Distinguished Level of Achievement Plan or the International Baccalaureate Program
- A high school GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Achieved a college readiness score on the SAT (1070) or ACT (23)
- Ranked in the top one-third of the prospective high school graduating class

We are excited to announce that the University of Wyoming now offers a Bachelor of Science degree in Construction Management. We expect to have our first graduating class in May 2022.

The discipline of Construction Management is experiencing amazing growth, especially in the Rocky Mountain West. Regionally, Construction Management jobs grew 169% between 2013-2018. Nationally, the forecast is for 45,000 new jobs in the field by 2026. Salaries are high.

What is Construction Management? It is the planning and oversight required to deliver projects on-time and onbudget. What do Construction Managers do? Budgeting, scheduling, site logistics including 3D modeling, safety planning, lots of communication and coordination with the owners, the local officials, and all the subcontractors on the job. You might work in an office, or in the field. You'll need to know a lot about decision-making. There is never a dull moment on a construction project.
