General Eligibility Requirements:

- Must be an African American high school student
- Must have a minimum 2.5 GPA on 4.0 scale
- Must be a permanent resident of or attend school in our service area
- OR... Must be a current or past participant in CCAC's Delta GEMS, EMBODI, or Cotillion program

Submission Requirements:

- Must submit a sealed official transcript with unweighted GPA on 4.0 scale to Scholarship Committee, PO Box 10, Allen, TX 75013.
- Must submit a photo (the photo will not be returned).
- Must submit two (2) letters of recommendation from teacher, academic counselor, community leader, volunteer coordinator, employer, coach or organizational sponsor.
- Each reference letter must be on letterhead to be accepted.
- Each reference letter must include: (1) the length of time they have known the applicant (2) applicant's personal qualities, character, leadership abilities, and/or any special attributes; and (3) why they believe the applicant has the perseverance to succeed at the college/university level.
- Must complete essay.
- All documents other than the official transcript can be attached to the online application. The official transcript must be mailed and postmarked by the application due date.
- Applications will be considered incomplete if all documentation is not provided.

The application deadline is **March 22, 2019**.

All winners will be notified on or before the 15th of April 2019.






Enrollment deposits are underway.

But if your students would prefer face-to-face meetings, we're offering additional ways to meet with us this spring.

New Cards at Night

The Office of Admissions is open Monday-Friday from 9-5 EST, and we're always happy to meet with students without an appointment. Students who can't make it to campus during the day can join us for New Cards at Night extended office hours **every Monday**, **January 28 - April 29 from 3-7 p.m**. They'll have the chance to meet with multiple university departments: admissions, campus housing, financial aid, orientation, metro college. Free and convenient parking is provided, and the meetings will take place in one, centralized location on campus. Virtual visits via Skype may be scheduled upon registration.


Preview Day allows us to roll out the red carpet for our guests and offer a first-hand look at the UofL School of Public Health & Information Sciences. You will:


