### 1- GENERAL KENDRICK SCHOLARSHIP - COLLIN COUNTY TAAO

Dear School Counselor.

The Collin County Chapter of TAAO is offering its annual Gerald Kendrick Scholarship to 2019 graduating high school seniors. This year we are offering two \$1,500 scholarships.

Our organization consists of members active in the fields of property appraisal and taxation. Scholarships are awarded in memory of Gerald Kendrick, a charter member of our chapter and former Tax Assessor Collector for the City of McKinney.

Scholarship recipients will be selected based on grade average, career goals and evaluation of their personal statement. A minimum grade point average of 3.2 on a 4.0 point scale is required. Attendance at a University, College or Junior College in Texas is also required.

A copy of the application is enclosed. Applications must be received by March 15<sup>th</sup> in order to be considered. Feel free to make copies of the application for distribution to eligible students. Also, please note the section at the bottom that <u>must</u> be completed and signed by the counselor or registrar. If the application does not include the transcript and/or is not signed by the counselor or registrar, it will be considered incligible. If needed, the counselor/registrar may email the transcript directly to the email address below with the students name in the subject.



## 3- 9TH ANNUAL DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING JR ESSAY/ORATION COMPETITION

This is a great opportunity for 5 High School Seniors in Frisco to win \$10K in scholarships. The Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Oration contest held every year for the last 8 years has awarded almost \$35K in scholarships to Frisco High school seniors. Last year alone, we awarded \$12K to 5 High School seniors.

Linking Cultures of Frisco, a Frisco non-profit, is once again hosting our 9th Annual Dr. Martin Luther King Jr Essay/Oration competition. This competition is open to any Frisco High School senior; there are no financial stipulations for entry. Last year's winners represented Lone Star, Wakeland, and Liberty High Schools. In prior years, Centennial has repeatedly had the highest representation of first place winners thanks to the debate team participants.

### LEARNING AND LEADERSHIP IN ACTION

### THE NANCY ANN AND RAY L. HUNT LEADERSHIP SCHOLARS PROGRAM

draws outstanding students who have an impressive mix of high academic achievement and proven leadership capabilities. The program combines intellectual rigor and unique opportunities to nurture leadership and learning. Selected students immediately become part of a close-knit community of peers and faculty committed to excellence, leadership and academic development. These exceptional student leaders from all walks of life apply their leadership skills to enrich the SMU campus and beyond, becoming tomorrow's visionaries with a global perspective.

### THE AWARD

Students selected as Hunt Leadership Scholars for the Class of 2023 will receive an annual Hunt Scholarship of \$42,000, or a total of \$168,000 over four years.

- Hunt Scholars may also be eligible for additional departmental scholarships or needbased aid for a total scholarship package valued up to the cost of tuition and fees.
- The award also covers the airfare and tuition costs for a cohort-based study abroad program during May term following each scholar's sophomore year.

### CAMPUS INVOLVEMENT AND LEADERSHIP

The SMU community is large and diverse enough to offer hundreds of organizations with different missions and small enough to permit students to assume meaningful leadership roles from the start. During each year of their SMU education, Hunt Leadership Scholars engage actively in the SMU community, honing their leadership skills and assuming leadership positions with increasing responsibility.

### BECOME A HUNT SCHOLAR

#### HOW TO APPLY

- In addition to submitting an application for admission to SMU, submit an online Hunt Leadership Scholarship application, including an essay and a YouTube statement, by January 15 of your senior year. Visit smu.edu/huntapply to submit the online application and supporting materials.
- Submitting a YouTube statement enables the selection committee to gain a deeper understanding of your personality and the qualities that make you an effective leader. Focus on the content of your response, not on the quality of the video. We care about what you say – not the appearance of the video!
- The selection committee will have access to your full application for admission, including letters of recommendation. If you believe that your existing letters of recommendation do not address your leadership skills and abilities, you may submit an additional letter from an individual with whom you have worked directly while serving in a leadership capacity.

### TIMELINE AND SELECTION PROCESS

- The program attracts hundreds of applicants.
- Approximately 60 finalists are invited to interview at SMU in March.
- Each year about 20-25 first-year students are selected as Hunt Leadership Scholars.
- Scholarship recipients are notified by the first week of April.

### HUNT SCHOLARS

The 2018–19 Hunt Leadership Scholars, first year through senior, cut a wide swath through the country, with 95 students coming from more than 80 high schools nationwide. They:

- · engage actively in the SMU and Dallas community
- · learn from some of the best professors in the nation
- meet and interact with national and international leaders
- · refine skills that allow them to compete successfully in a rapidly changing world
- · apply their intellectual abilities to leadership and community participation
- cross the globe through SMU's study abroad programs and SMU's affiliation with the George W. Bush Presidential Center

The Hunt Leadership Scholarship is one of the most generous and prestigious leadership scholarships in the country, and it allows students to combine learning and leadership in a unique way at SMU. We are looking for 20-25 students each year who have demonstrated extraordinary leadership in high school, and who will passionately pursue leadership as Mustangs. Hunt Scholars take a leadership development course together during their first semester on campus, study abroad together, enjoy wide access to the Tate Lecture Series, engage with campus, community, and world leaders, and create a lifelong network of leaders by working alongside one another.

Students selected as Hunt Leadership Scholars for the Class of 2023 will receive an annual Hunt Scholarship of \$42,000 or a total of \$168,000 over four years. The Hunt Scholarship may be stacked up to tuition and fees with need-based aid, outside scholarships, and many of SMU's departmental scholarship, but it will replace and supersede any centrally administered merit aid. Additionally, the Hunt Scholarship covers full tuition and airfare for a leadership-based study abroad program during May term following the scholars' sophomore year.

### Oklahoma State Scholars Society

We are excited for the second year of our Oklahoma State Scholars Society, a scholarship program for students showing the greatest potential. This four-year, cost-of-attendance scholarship is the first of its kind for Oklahoma State University.

Eligible students must have at least a 27 ACT or 1280 SAT, a 3.8 unweighted GPA and must apply for admission to OSU and to The Honors College by Nov. 1. Semi-finalists will be selected by a faculty committee and invited to interview in the spring. Up to five finalists will be selected to receive this prestigious award.

### McKnight Scholars Leadership Program

Out-of-state students with demonstrated leadership and community involvement are encouraged to apply for the McKnight Scholars Leadership Program.

The McKnight Scholarship provides a waiver for the out-of-state portion of tuition, as well as \$5,000 additional scholarship support for the first two years of a student's OSU career. Approximately 50 highly qualified students will be selected to participate in this leadership development and scholarship program.

Interested students must submit an application at McKnightScholars.com by Nov. 1. This application requires three letters of recommendation or "nominations" in addition to the application. Nominators should also submit their letters at McKnightScholars.com by Nov. 1.

### Ways to Praise

Encouraging intrinsic pride and celebration when self-control is practiced. Example, "I noticed you thought about how that choice impacted others before making it.", "I see when you took a step back, you were able to think through a solution."



### Self-control is not:

- · Struggling to manage emotions.
- · Acting out based on feelings.
- Acting in a way that does not consider those around you.



### **3 – THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS AT AUSTIN - UPDATE**

I am writing with an important update for your juniors (high school graduating class of 2020).

Each fall The University of Texas at Austin announces the rank that current high school juniors in Texas will need to be eligible for automatic admission when they apply during the next application cycle. UT's President Gregory L. Fenves recently announced that Texas students will be eligible for automatic admission if they are in the top 6% of their graduating classes when they apply to summer/fall 2020 and spring 2021. This is the same rank required for automatic admission for fall 2019 and spring 2020. This information has already been sent to the Education Service Centers.


