About Our Community

Frisco is an upper-middle-class community located approximately 30 miles north of Dallas, Texas. Frisco ISD is one of the fastest growing districts in Texas. The community has a current population of over 150,000. The district instructs over 57,000 students and has 68 campuses.

About Our School

Frisco High School has a total enrollment of approximately 1500 students in grades 9-12. FHS is accredited by the Texas Education Agency. Out of the class of 2017, eighty-five percent of the student body was college-bound. Sixty-three percent attended four year schools and twenty-two attended two year schools. While students are encouraged to volunteer in the community, community service hours are not required for graduation.

All courses taken during the regular school year shall count toward GPA, except for the following: aide positions, peer tutoring, college credits that are not dual credits, credit by examination credits, correspondence school courses, summer school courses and summer abroad courses such as the People to People program.
