Chemistry Students Get Hands On In Class:

Chemistry students performed an experiment to learn the difference between physical and chemical changes in Ms. Lauren Berger's and Coach Daniel Dollinger's classes recently. The students worked with substances including magnesium, hydrochloric acid, and sodium chloride to determine physical and chemical changes. The seven mini experiments included procedures such as using a magnesium ribbon to remove tarnish from sandpaper. The classes took notes over physical and chemical changes to prepare for the experiment. "They can put their notes into use," Ms. Berger said. "This is really for them to see, 'Ok, there's a face change, that's a physical change."

Students were able to relate this experiment to their day-to-day life. "This experiment is teaching me the difference between physical and chemical changes," Jorge Sandoval, 11th grader, said. The students enjoyed this experiment because of all the active elements. "It had chemicals," Josh Rios, 10th grader, said about the specific reasons why he liked this lab. Along with applying the information they learned about physical and chemical changes, students got a chance to refine their lab techniques. Acids and bunsen burners were involved in the procedure, so students wore goggles and aprons. A violation of the safety rules results in a zero or an alternate assignment. Experiments give students a chance to get hands-on experience and practice their skills, an opportunity they enjoy.

Students were fascinated by the changes when the outcome brought a pop, flame or color change. "This experiment was definitely the best we have had so far and the changes are cool," Kaleigh Elizondo, 10th grader, said. Other hands-on activities in chemistry make learning more relevant.
