#### Photojournalism Kids Featured on the New York Times:

Eighteen, current and former Frisco High School, students had images selected for the New York Times Lens Blog's recent project, "My Hometown." Their photos are featured in the Texas section of entries, which are searchable by student name. The project was inspired by the FSA's documentation of farmers during the Depression, according to the Lens Blog. This project was based on the belief of using photography as a learning tool and getting a different view of society, one from a teen's viewpoint. More than 3,000 students from 45 states submitted images to this project. Most of the images are slated to be archived at the Library of Congress in the Prints and

Photographs Division. Students were given this assignment in Ms. Toni Marsh's Photojournalism class in the late spring of the last school year. This assignment was a way to get other people to view their work. 

## **FHS Attendance Policy:**

Under Texas Education Code 25.094, a student is in violation of the Compulsory Attendance law if the student has issues of truancy 3 days or parts of days in a four week period or 10 days or parts of days in a six month period. Tardiness is considered part of a school day. It is the responsibility of the parent to

monitor their child's attendance. As a reminder, according to Texas Education Code 25.093, a parent is subject to prosecution when his/her child fails to attend school regularly. Once the student accumulates 10 UNEXCUSED absences within a 6 month period, Truancy Charges shall be filed. In order for a

student to receive credit in a class, the student must meet the 90 % attendance rule for that class. On the 5th absence in a class for the semester, the student can lose credit in that class for the semester.

### **PSAT Offered Oct 16th:**

All 9th, 10th and 11th grade students will take the PSAT on Wednesday, October 16, 2013. This will be given in the morning 9 a.m. - noon. The students will resume their regular B day schedule from 12:15 p.m. - 4:10 p.m. Calculators will be provided for all 11th grade students, 9th and 10th grade students will need to bring their own to use on the test. Scientific or graphic calculators are acceptable, cell phones and/or electronic devices are not allowed. Students who take the PSAT before taking the SAT tend to score 136 points higher on the SAT. Juniors also have a chance to earn National Merit Recognition by doing well which could lead to scholarship opportunities. On October 16th, our FHS seniors will be attending a mandatory assembly that will cover several important topics affecting their senior year.
