Dear Heritage Family:

Monday, January 29th is our Rising Freshmen Night. Students will have the opportunity to tour the school, learn more about academics, athletics, club and organizations. Teachers, coaches and sponsors will be available to answer questions. The evening begins at 6:00 p.m., and our families are free to look around and meet the staff until 7:00 p.m. At that time, families will be in the auditorium to hear Principal Mimms and our Lead Counselor, Valerie Harrison, give a brief presentation on what to expect during the first year of high school. Parchment News – first semester transcripts are currently being processed. At this time, when ordering a transcript in your Parchment account for a college please choose "Hold for Grades". Once transcripts are complete they will be processed. Notification will be made when transcripts are complete and normal ordering will resume.

Important Health Information from the Nurse

Respiratory illnesses are common this time of year. Influenza activity in Collin County is currently widespread and increasing. Please familiarize yourself with the signs and symptoms of the flu and keep your child home if they exhibit them. **Influenza usually comes on suddenly and may include fever, headache, body aches, tired/fatigue, cough, sore throat, runny/stuffy nose, nausea. A common cold is usually milder and may include cough, sore throat, runny/stuffy nose but rarely causes fever, headache, body aches, or fatigue.

Please notify attendance and/or the nurse directly if your child is absent due to the flu or flu-like symptoms in order to accurately track rates of illness and report our data to the county health department for surveillance. When reporting your child's absence due to illness, specific symptom details are important for us to categorize our data.

Here are some friendly reminders on preventing illness:

The single most important thing you can do to prevent getting ill and spreading illness to others is to WASH YOUR HANDS!

Parents should consider having their families vaccinated against the flu.

Stay home when ill to avoid spreading germs and illnesses to others.

Practice coughing/sneezing etiquette to help stop the spread of germs:

- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when you cough or sneeze.
- Put your used tissue in a waste basket.
- If you don't have a tissue, cough or sneeze into your upper sleeve, not your hands

Remember to wash your hands after coughing or sneezing

As Valentine's Day approaches, we would like to remind our Coyote families about deliveries and messages. Because of the large number of students enrolled at Frisco ISD High Schools, office staff will accept deliveries for students under very limited circumstances. Office staff will accept delivery of items such as schoolwork, books or class materials in addition to clothing or uniforms needed for class or other school related activities. Messages for students will be accepted only for emergencies or in regard to transportation changes. Office staff will not accept delivery of flowers, candy or gifts for students.

Students may bring items for their friends; however, any disruption of the learning environment (for example: large stuffed animals, balloons) will be addressed by the Heritage High School Administration.

Please note that food deliveries from third parties are not allowed at Heritage High School. This includes, but is not limited to, services such as UberEats, Grubhub, Door Dash, Favor, etc.

Only food delivered for individual students by their parents is allowed. Thank you for your cooperation.

The graduation date and time for the Heritage Class of 2018 has been set. Our graduation ceremony will take place on Saturday, June 2, 2018 at 1:00 p.m. at The Ford Center. Mandatory graduation practice for seniors is Thursday, May 31st in the Competition Gym.

As we move into our winter months, we'd like to remind you about the district's bad weather policy. If a decision must be made as to school closing or a late opening, announcements will be posted on the front of the **Frisco ISD website**, social media channels such as **Twitter** and **Facebook** and on area radio and television stations. The District will also utilize the phone/email/text message system to communicate directly with parents, so please be sure to have up-to-date contact information on file at your child's school. The goal is to have a decision made by 5:30 a.m. **Otherwise, schools will be open as scheduled.**

Every student that parks on campus will need a parking sticker and this year, FISD is implementing a parking permit fee for students. We sell parking permits in the front office from 8:00 to 9:00 a.m., during lunches, and 4:15 to 4:30 p.m. each school day. If needed, students may pick up a copy of the required paperwork in the front office during normal office hours.

Please note that if your student needs an additional parking sticker, there is no additional charge. If your student drives more than one vehicle onto campus, or if you have a vehicle change for your student, only the completed additional paperwork is required. **Student parking stickers are NOT transferrable.**

In order to maximize your student's class time and make this year a success, please note the following information:

PARKING: The parking stickers are scheduled to be delivered to our campus the first week of September. At that time, students may complete the process of submitting paperwork, paying for the permit, and receiving the sticker for their car.

ATTENDANCE: Information regarding absence reporting for your student can be found on the Heritage website.

DELIVERIES: Students need to remember to bring all necessary items with them to school in the morning. It is important to minimize classroom disruptions, so please remember to send lunch money, lunches, clothing, books and supplies with your child in the morning rather than deliver it during the day. Any food not picked up on the day of delivery will be disposed of the following day.

LUNCH: Please remember that FISD schools are closed campuses. That means students are to remain on campus during lunch periods. Parents are welcome to bring lunch to their child, and eat with them in the cafeteria.

SIGNING OUT: We are happy to call your student to the front office to be checked out once you are in the office, but do not call students in advance. This will help keep our students in the classroom as much as possible. Thank you in advance for your help in this matter.

VERIFICATION OF ENROLLMENT: There is a 24 hour turn-around time to receive a Verification of Enrollment (VOE) for your trip to the DMV. Students should come into the front office 24 hours in advance and sign up to receive one.
