NCAA: What you need to know

NCAA Eligibility Requirements

- Division I and Division II requires 16 core courses
- Minimum SAT/ACT for Division 1 based on sliding scale (see back page)
- SAT minimum score of 820 for Division II (reading and math combined)
- ACT minimum score of 68 for Division II (reading, math, English and science combined)
- GPA requirements are calculated using only NCAA approved courses. Minimum GPA for Division 1 based on sliding scale (see back page). Division II Minimum GPA = 2.000.
- SAT and ACT scores must be reported directly to the Eligibility Center. When registering for the SAT or ACT, use the NCAA Eligibility Center code of 9999 to make sure the score is reported.
- Students enrolling at an NCAA Division I or II institution for the first time need to also complete the amateurism questionnaire through the Eligibility Center Web site. Students need to request final amateurism certification prior to enrollment in college.

NCAA Registration

Students wanting to play NCAA Division I or Division II sports must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center. Students must meet the eligibility requirements, fill out the registration form (online), pay the registration fee of \$70, and complete the amateurism questionnaire. Once all of this is completed the students eligibility will be determined by the NCAA Eligibility Center.

Economically disadvantaged students may be eligible to receive a fee waiver to assist with the registration fee. Please see your counselor if you have any questions. It is the student's responsibility to be sure they are following all of the policies required by the NCAA. If students have questions, they should contact NCAA directly. Steps for NCAA Registration:

- 1. Register at www.eligiblitycenter.org
- 2. Complete amateurism questionnaire
- 3. Fill out Student Release Form online
- 4. Pay the \$70 registration fee (or submit fee waiver)
- 5. Print copy of completed registration
- 6. Sign the transcript release and give to Mrs. Gibson, HHS Registrar
- Register to take the SAT, ACT, or both and use Eligibility Center Code (9999) to make sure the score is reported to the Eligibility Center (NCAA will not accept scores sent from high schools). Eligibility Center will use best scores from each section of the ACT or SAT to determine best cumulative score.
- Double check courses you have taken match your school's NCAA list of approved
- 9. Request final amateurism certification on or after April 1 of senior year.
- 10. For Division I, student must graduate "on time" or in eight semesters.

DIVISION I

16 Core-Course Rule

16 Core Courses:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher)

2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school).

- 1 year of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science.
- 2 years of social science
- 4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy)

DIVISION II

16 Core-Course Rule

- 16 Core Courses:
- 3 years of English
- 2 years of mathematics (Algebra I or higher)

2 years of natural/physical science (1 year of lab if offered by high school)

- 3 years of additional English, mathematics or natural/physical science
- 2 years of social science

4 years of additional courses (from any area above, foreign language or nondoctrinal religion/philosophy)
