Grading System

- All semester course grades with the exception of local courses, correspondence courses, credits by exam, and summer school courses are included in GPA and class rank.
- Rank in class is determined on the basis of semester grades earned in grades nine, ten, eleven, and twelve.
- For a student to earn credit for a course that is a full year in length the average of the two semester grades must equal a minimum of 70.
- Grade points are awarded based upon the grade earned and the designation of the course as Regular, Dual Credit, Pre-AP, or AP.
- Rank in class is based on the weighted 5.0 grade point average.

Daily Schedule

Heritage High School operates on an A/B Block schedule with 4 classes meeting every other day for a period of 1.5 hours.
