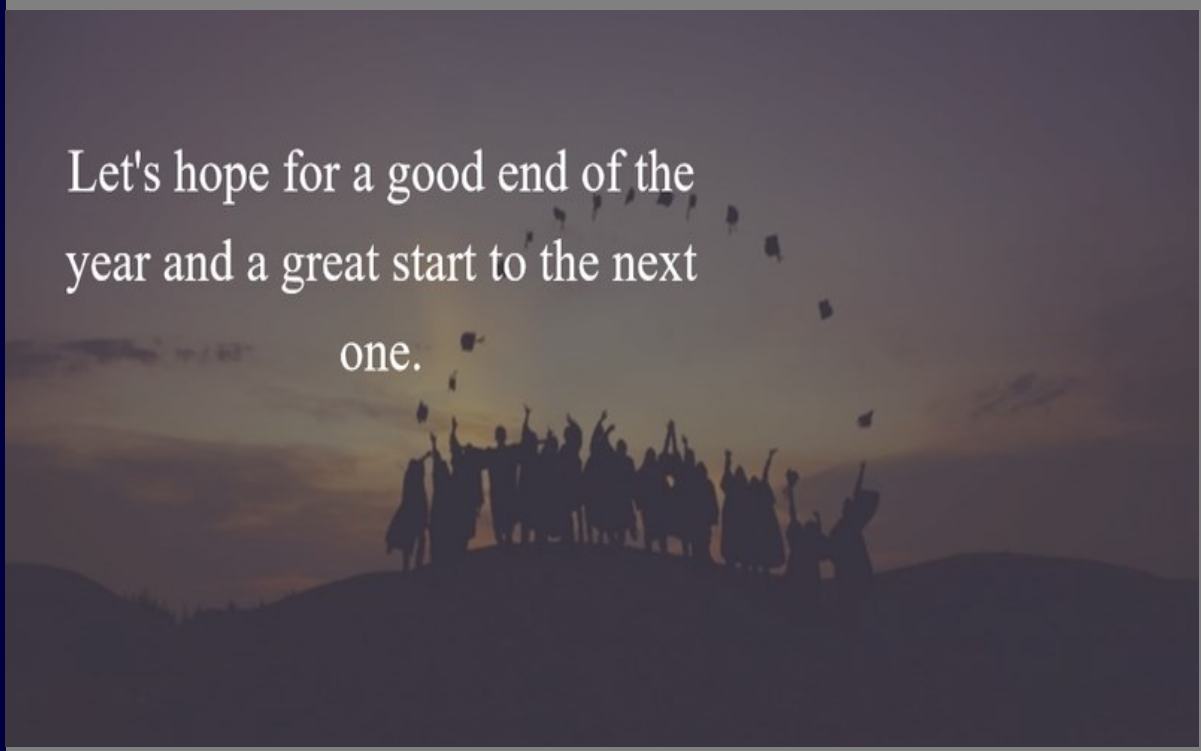

CONNECTEDNESS

The belief by students that adults and peers in the school care about their learning as well as about them as Individuals.



Connectedness is important because

Students who feel connected at school have higher academic performance, enjoy school more, show greater signs of mental health and show fewer instances of unhealthy coping behaviors (bullying, self-harm, drug use, etc.).

- THEY CAN IDENTIFY AT LEAST ONE ADULT WHO IS SUPPORTIVE
- THEY BELONG TO A POSITIVE PEER GROUP
- THEY ARE COMMITTED TO A HEALTHY LIFESTYLE

ARE NOT CONNECTED
at school when

- THEY CANNOT IDENTIFY AN ADULT WHO IS SUPPORTIVE
- THEY HAVE INCONSISTENT FRIEND GROUPS
- THEY EXHIBIT UNHEALTHY COPING BEHAVIORS

WAYS TO PRACTICE

- Encourage student decision-making that includes the student, family and campus staff
- Increase partnership and collaboration between home and school to show consistency and belonging
- Foster trusting and caring relationships between home and campus staff

The student must be listed on the lease agreement.), and double check that your child's immunization records are up to date and reflect all the requirements of the state of Texas, which may vary from other states/countries.
