

Team News

Welcome to Fowler, 6th graders!

In social studies, we will be learning about the themes of physical and human geography and exploring the elements that make up all of our diverse cultures. We will then use these themes of geography and cultural elements to begin our journey of world cultures.

The sixth grade ILA students will start the year by studying personal narratives using the novel My Life in Dog Years by Gary Paulsen. The students will apply their understanding of

summarization, sequencing, and the writing process to complete a major project. These skills will aid in the development of writing a personal narrative about an event that greatly affected and changed their lives. Sixth grade Fowler science students will start with safety in the lab. We will learn to use both preventative and emergency safety equipment. Once students have demonstrated their mastery of safety, we will begin studying process skills. We will plan and implement lab investigations, analyze data, and form conclusions. It's going to be a busy start!

Welcome to sixth grade math! We will begin by setting a strong foundation by diving into factors, multiples and prime factorization. After that, we will be reviewing adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions and decimals. In addition to this, the students will be required to complete Think Through Math on a weekly basis starting September 6.

To begin the year, 7th grade science classes will introduce lab safety and graphing, while PreAP science students will begin working on ISEF/Independent Research projects. Texas history classes will be starting the year by studying the four natural regions of Texas and the Native American Indian tribes of Texas. ILA classes will be working on writing a personal narrative and learning the techniques of revising a narrative. PreAP ILA students will engage in activities related to their summer reading novel, <u>Drums, Girls, and Dangerous Pie</u> by Jordan Sonnen-

blick. 7th grade GT ILA students will be analyzing the craft of a writer in the Lone Star Books. Then, students will create book trailers about one of the Lone Star books. Our 7th grade mathematicians will review some operations with rational numbers and solve problems involving proportionality.

Welcome back Fowler students! We hope you had a great summer break and are as excited as we are to begin your 2016-17 journey through 8th grade science. Science! This year we will study scientific concepts in laboratory tools and procedures, with our major emphasis on earth sciences. Our topics this year will include the scientific method, the solar system and the universe, and then we come back to Earth to study how our oceans drive atmospheric events including the weather. We, then, take 7th grade concepts a bit deeper as we investigate ecological processes, as well as weathering, erosion and deposition and how these processes affect the Earth's topography. We will also highlight the foundations of physics and chemistry. The 8th grade U.S. History teach-

topography. We will also highlight the foundations of physics and chemistry. The 8th grade U.S. History teachers are excited to start a new year. We will be exploring and colonizing America for the first 6 weeks. Students will be encouraged to complete flipped assignments located on our Moodle site on the Student Learning Hub. Our classes will also be conducting special activities during Celebrate Freedom Week (September 12-17th). We will kick off the school year in math by studying real numbers and their properties; this includes classifying and ordering real numbers, as well as converting between fractions, decimals, and percentages. Shortly after, we will discover the Pythagorean Theorem and its application in the real world. Please check the Learning Hub to stay current. Finally, our ILA teachers are looking forward to a fun-filled year where we will implement various strategies and activities to strengthen your child's reading and writing skills. Pre-AP ILA will begin with analyzing the summer reading novel, The Messenger, by Lois Lowry, in which Pre-AP students will further explore the themes found within the novel. ILA will focus on a variety of literature selections in preparation for the upcoming unit over heroism and its many forms. We can't wait to get the year started!

Mrs. Silver's Technology Class Info

All the students will have a great time and learn a lot in the computer classes at Fowler. The following is a summary of what we will be doing throughout the school year. Please note – copyright issues are discussed in all these classes.

Multimedia I:

The students will review their file management skills, and they will also learn how to create a Google calendar and other Google apps and functions. They will create a Fairy Tale PowerPoint presentation using the 4 different types of animation they will learn in class. The students will learn how to use PhotoShop Elements. They will love this software. They will learn how to edit photos, create and enhance text, as well as lots of other fun effects that they will create with this software. If you have any old or damaged photos at home; they will be able to make them look like new! The students will learn about using audio and inputting it into their projects. The students will also create an original E-Book by creating the story, title, and illustrating it themselves. They will use their audio knowledge to record their story and create a voice over to include in their E-Book; they will be able to see their digital book in an epub software – pretty exciting!

Multimedia II- Video Production II:

The students will review file management and update their Google calendars. They will create CD covers using PhotoShop Elements, using the digital cameras to take pictures of themselves or their phones, then edit them and combine images on the canvas to create realistic photos. Then, they will use Powtoons software to create a presentation. They will explore how to use Google presentations to create an informational presentation about what they learned in Multimedia I last year. It will be a great learning experience for them! Color is another topic we will review as it is important to understand the psychology of color in order to apply it to whatever you are creating. Next, we will be back in PSE creating patterns and textures. The students will use Google sketch up to create a building and then place it into Google Earth. The students will learn a little about HTML coding and create some web pages. The students will also do work for teachers around the school (creating flyers, etc.) if any teachers have the need for our "business". The students will also create a virtual museum to display some of their Photoshop projects. They will also create a website to display their work from MM2 and VP2. Stay tuned for more fun information from this class.

In VP2- the students will learn more skills related to video production. They will learn how to create different effects such as coming out from behind a pole, mirroring themselves, creating lightening effects, etc.

They will work in groups to develop ideas and brainstorm as to which projects they might like to do. We also create some videos for the Broadcast class to incorporate into their projects.

Animation:

Again, the skill of proper file management will be reinforced as well as creating a Google calendar. All the students in class will create a website to display their animations. You will also be able to see what they have worked on in class! Just ask them to show you their site. The students will practice sketching characters for projects; they will learn how to draw different characters and will learn how to draw eyes, noses, mouths, etc. The students will create an original character to use in projects throughout the year. They will incorporate their character to create an original comic strip. They usually come out really cute!

They will work in groups to research the history of animation and choose an animator to research. Then, working with their group, they will put together a presentation to show to the class about what they learned. From there they will create an animation using an app called "Sock Puppets" on the iPad from the school library. The students will begin with learning 2d animation using FlipBook software. From there – they will go into 3D software. I know I am looking forward to meeting all the characters; they should be very interesting.





The beginning of a new school year is always an exciting time for Fowler Middle School students. This is a great time for all students to step out on the right foot as they journey through many fun and significant opportunities ahead in the 2016-2017 school year. The counselors, along with all of our staff members, value the opportunity to work with students and parents to make the middle school years a positive and challenging time as students learn and grow in all aspects of their lives.


Book Clubs—Our Library Lunch book clubs are casual, fun, and open to anyone! At meetings we'll read books


