# Team News



## 6th

In 6<sup>th</sup> grade social studies, students will continue their study of world cultures and geography in Central America, South America, and the Caribbean. Students will learn about the historical influences that cultures around the world have had on the region and will also complete a Culture Pizza project over an assigned Latin American country. In ILA, the students have been reading the novels Where the Red Fern Grows and The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane novels to identify the changes in a character's internal and external character traits. In addition to character traits, students have been labeling different types of figurative language. Students will begin writing their imaginative story which will include a believable setting created through the usage of sensory details. In Science for the third six weeks, students will be studying biology! They will study ecosystems (including a project involving our national parks!), the basic components of the cell, and the Cell Theory. They will learn more about the characteristics of organisms, including prokaryotic or eukaryotic, unicellular or multicellular, autotrophic or heterotrophic, and mode of reproduction. This will then lead them into their study of taxonomy. It's going to be a busy unit! Sixth grade math will be wrapping up proportions and percents. We will be learning about rational numbers and the Cartesian plane as we head into Winter Break. Please be sure your student is continuing to work on TTM every week. Thank you so much for your support! The students have quickly adapted to the pace of sixth grade!

## 7th

7<sup>th</sup> graders have been very industrious this fall! Texas history classes have been traveling back in time.....to the Spanish Colonial era from 1680-1760 and the Mexican National era. This past week, we traveled to the year 1821; Mexico has won independence from Spain, and Texas is now part of Mexico. Students are learning about empresarios (such as Stephen F. Austin) who began colonization of Mexican Texas with settlers from the United States. Math classes are beginning to raise funds for FISD's Angel program. The class period that raises the most money will compete against grade-level teachers in a student-faculty basketball game. Students are solving equations and inequalities. All science students are beginning their journey through the human body systems. In Pre-AP Science, we are also continuing our science fair experimentation at home and are looking ahead to a completion date of December 12<sup>th</sup>! Students will be presenting their science fair projects in class. Expository writing: here we come! All on-level and Pre AP ILA students are writing expository essays by focusing on writing assertions that are supported by text evidence and commentary. Students are encouraged to read non-fiction pieces outside of class to expand their expository writing skills. GT ILA students are learning about the different persuasive techniques that are used in advertising. They will transfer this knowledge to analyzing a persuasive advertisement of their own choice.

## 8th

The election is here! The social studies department is hosting a mock "presidential election" on November 4<sup>th</sup> for students to better understand election procedures and the democratic process! U. S. History classes are also learning about the many compromises that were made at the Constitutional Convention in order to create our Constitution. In ILA classes, we are looking forward to our media and persuasive techniques unit. 8<sup>th</sup> graders will embark upon a powerful journey to explore modern media and Aristotle's appeals. The students will be able to answer the two essential questions: *How does commercialism impact daily life? How does research enhance the ability to persuade?* Winter is almost here, and 8th Grade Math is getting ready to hit the 'slopes'! In addition to writing and solving linear equations, students will also start graphing them as well. From there, students will analyze and interpret graphs to see how they pertain to everyday, real world situations while the 8<sup>th</sup> grade algebra students will be studying the properties of exponents and solving sequence problems. Finally, 8<sup>th</sup> grade science is starting our ecology unit. We will study interactions between biotic and abiotic factors in ecosystems. The science fair is almost here! Pre-AP science will be putting the final touches on their science fair projects. Good luck Falcons!

# Technology Class Information The Falcon Reporter

All the students are having a good time and learning a lot in the computer classes at Fowler. The following is a summary of the learning that has been occurring in the classes.

## Multimedia I: Terri Silver


The students have been continuing to develop their PhotoShop Element skills. They created an original magazine cover featuring themselves on the front – the inside stories reflect their personalities and interests. They will learn how to create a reflection and create a magazine advertisement for a product. Information about advertising techniques will also be discussed. The students will soon learn how to edit sound using audacity. They will create their own sound effects and do projects before incorporating their sounds in other software. They are becoming experts at using the software in class. Soon, they will start creating an original children's story book.

## Multimedia II: Terri Silver

The students have been extending their knowledge of using PhotoShop Elements. They have learned about creating logos and created their own personal logos. They have also been using their talents to create programs for the Veteran's Day Celebration in school, using what they learned in class and applying it to real – life scenarios. The students have created music online and created an old time radio broadcast with a partner. They learned about QR codes and how to create them. Then they created their own codes. The students will use Sketchup to create a building and then place it in Google earth. In the future, we will also be learning some basic web development. The students will learn some basic html code and be able to create some simple websites. Stay tuned for more fun information from this class.

## Animation: Terri Silver

The students have been creating animations using FlipBook software. In the future, they will incorporate using Sketchup in their projects to create a bowling alley. They have worked on creating a beach scene, a flower growing, and a haunted house. Soon, they will be working on creating the working bowling alley. Sound is also incorporated in the animations. The students are working hard and doing a wonderful job with their animations; – I am so proud of them. You should be able to find samples of their projects on their websites. 
