The spellers who competed in the bee were selected through preliminary classroom bees held during ILA classes in November. Classroom bee winners were given study materials in order to prepare for the competition.



The **Fowler Science Department** is so proud of all of our PreAP students this fall semester. Each of them has completed a 4-month extended research project, which is a huge undertaking for a middle school student. This year our students could select from a competitive project (ISEF, or International Science and Engineering Fair) or non-competitive project (IRP, or Independent Research Project.) ISEF students have been attending weekly meetings with their coaches before and after school, as well as completing a highly rigorous project following ISEF quidelines.

In addition to the research presentation, students will begin to read the novels Number the Stars and Fever to identify character's changes and different themes presented throughout the novel.

pean Union, then completing a research project over European culture. Next stop on our journey around the world: Russia and the Eurasian Republics!

In science for the fourth six weeks, students will study energy! During this unit, students will compare and contrast potential and kinetic energy and demonstrate energy transformations. In addition, they will investigate methods of thermal energy transfer. Finally, classes will research the advantages and disadvantages of using fossil fuels and alternative energy sources.

Sixth grade math begins the new semester with an introduction to Algebra! We will learn to write algebraic equations as well as solve equations and inequalities. Don't forget to keep up with TTM at home. By February 1st, on level should have successfully completed 44 lessons and Pre Ap should have 50.

7th Graders are ringing in the New Year with exciting happenings! In PreAP Science, our campus Science Fair will be held the week of January 9th through 13th. Students are excited to showcase their work. All science students are in the final stages of the unit on human body systems, and we look forward to our next unit on genetics. The mighty mathematicians will be taking the practice STAAR test on March 29th. Please make sure your child is present on this day and has pencils, a sandwich-size Ziploc filled with snacks, and bottled water. We are working on Module 4 -Scales, Similar Figures, and Equations! In ILA, students have investigated how persuasion influences peoples' choices. Students wrote a business letter using persuasive appeals and studied the art of persuasion in writing. For our next unit, students will refine their expository writing skills. Our budding writers are also learning about the many different ways that they can revise their sentence structure. GT ILA students are reading *The Adventures of Tom* Sawyer by Mark Twain and will analyze the choices made by the characters in the novel and relate the concept of choices and consequences to their own lives. We are looking ahead to our 7th Grade STAAR Writing assessment on March 28th. Texas history classes have fought the Texas Revolution and won their independence from Mexico! Our young historians have learned about many of the important battles, people, and issues that make Texas so unique. We are wrapping up the years of the Republic of Texas from 1836-1845 and will soon be learning about the annexation and early statehood of Texas.

Did your student happen to make financial literacy a 2017 New Year's resolution?! Either way, students will be exploring simple and compound interest, as well as discussing the terms of loans and investments. We will also touch on researching information about colleges and developing a financial plan to get there. We are looking forward to seeing students' wise investments in the upcoming weeks! Our Falcon scientists will slide into the new year studying Alfred Wegener's theory of plate tectonics and how this theory helps explain the topography, or landforms, we see around our planet. Our Pre-AP scientists have completed and presented their science fair projects. The projects will be on display in our library for the campus science fair judging. The campus fair will be Jan 10-12 and parents are welcome to view what our scientists worked hard to study, prepare and present. Just a note about the campus fair, parents may want to view projects the 10th and the 12th because we will have another team of teachers, from a visiting campus, judging our projects on the 11th. In ILA, students will be completing an independent reading project. Time will be set aside in class for this assignment, as well as required reading outside of school. You should see your child read! Students will analyze conflict, characterization, figurative language and so much more. In PreAP ILA students will begin the new year in the Count of Monte Cristo literary analysis unit. Students will be reading nightly and making annotations for class discussions. This novel explores complex character motivations and plot twists that cannot be assessed accurately without focused, scheduled reading time. Thank you for encouraging your students with their outside reading requirements in January and February! Please continue to check HAC and visit our teacher website for important news and documents. Presidents! Presidents! 8th Grade U. S. History classes will be studying our early American presidents, Washington through Monroe. Students will also explore our early repub-

lic through domestic and foreign policies of the early presidents.


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Our last **Spanish Club** meeting was a big success! Students participated in several rounds of Bingo. During the meeting, we ate chips, salsa, queso and bean dip. The words on the bingo cards were cognates, or Spanish words that sound like their English counterparts, and

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the student that won each round recieved a certain type of chocolate. These chocolates were created in molds that had shapes such as skulls and bones to represent El Dia de Los Muertos. This is a traditional Spanish holiday to celebrate the memory of passed loved ones and is celebrated at the beginning of November.





Mrs. Silver's Technology Class Information

All the students are having a good time and learning a lot in the computer classes at Fowler. The following is a summary of the learning that has been occurring in the classes.

All of my technology classes participated in the "Hour of Code". They learned about different coding techniques and why it is important that they learn about coding. The classes spent a week trying out the different software online to practice how to do code. There were different levels – from easy to more difficult types of coding for them to try. The students all commented that they really enjoyed the activities. We hope to continue this activity as a yearly fun way to interest the students in coding.

The students have been editing sound using audacity software. They created their own sound effects and incorporated their sounds into other software. The students are creating, narrating, and illustrating an original children's storybook – We will E-publish the book. If there is time, their last project for the semester will be creating an E-portfolio of their work. They should bring in a flash drive if they would like to save their work to put on their computer at home. They are becoming experts at learning new software in class and applying their knowledge to real life situations.

The students have created sound effects in online software. The students have created QR codes – and placed the codes on a flyer for MM2. Now, they are learning some basic web development. The students are learning some basic html code and should be able to create some simple websites. They will also build a website to display their work. The students will be creating a virtual museum, using Sketch Up; they will place their PhotoShop artwork to display on the walls of the museum. They have also created flyers for teachers in the school. The students have really been doing a wonderful job this year. I am anxious to see what they create in Video Production 2 next semester.

Animation: Terri Silver


The students have been creating animations using Flip Book software, PhotoShop Elements, and Sketch Up. They have been doing a wonderful job creating a variety of animations – from a haunted house to an animated holiday E-card. The students are working hard and doing a terrific job with their animations; they have grown so much in their capabilities. I am so proud of them. Next, they will be creating a stop motion animation, a 360⁰ animation, and an animated musical instrument.
