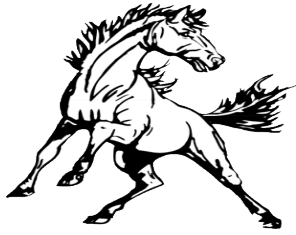

Title I Involvement

- A yearly parent meeting is held to explain the Title I program, funding, how federal funds are used to support at-risk students, and to provide input into the Parent Involvement/Engagement Policy.
- Parents are members of the Campus Improvement Team along with teachers, administrators, and community members serving in an advisory capacity. The CIT annually reviews and revised the Campus Improvement Plan and Parent Involvement Policy.
- A Campus Action Plan is written with SMART goals based on our campus needs assessment (campus needs assessment committees; parent survey results; student data, STAAR). If the plan is not satisfactory to parents, the school will submit parent comments on the plan.
- Title I Fund expenditures are based on campus needs and documented in the Campus Action Plan.

School-Parent-Student Compacts

In accordance with the Title I regulations, our campus will annually update a School-Parent-Student Compact. This compact will provide an outline to enable the school, parents/caregivers, and students to share responsibility for student performance and success.

Compacts are signed and dated by all stakeholders. Classroom teachers review the compact with students prior to signing.

The compacts are distributed to parents, signed, and returned to the student's classroom teacher. Both the school and the parent keep a copy for their records.

Building Capacity Initiatives

1. Assistance is provided to parents/families in understanding academic standards, academic assessments, monitoring progress, and how to improve achievement in a variety of ways such as, conferences, Home Access Center, Student Learning Hub, Meet the Teacher Night, Progress Reports and Report Cards.
2. Staley utilizes the Student Learning Hub with parents in order to provide information on how to work with their children to improve achievement.
3. Staff members understand the importance of parental involvement in a child's education. Input from parents is solicited throughout the year in meetings, surveys, and parent/teacher conferences. The Parent Teacher Association works with parents and the school to increase parental involvement through the school year.
4. Staley parents have access to the parent resource center that is located at the district's Early Childhood School.
5. Information related to school and parent/family programs, meetings, and other activities is communicated through marquee, websites, newsletters, and the Student Learning Hub. Correspondence that is sent home is done in both English and Spanish.
