

Academic Teaming

- Every student is assigned to an academic team
- The students on each team have all the same core teachers electives at the same time
- Teachers plan together 45 minutes daily
- The teachers are able to stay abreast of student's academic and behavioral success
- Same team all year

Grading



Extracurricular Activities


- 6th graders are encouraged to attend all school activities.

What is Pre-AP?

- Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered at the high school through the College Board and allow students to take a test to earn college credit.
- Pre-Advanced Placement (Pre-AP) courses are offered at the middle school and are designed to challenge students with a more rigorous curriculum. This also gives students an idea of how rigorous Advanced Placement courses are and prepares them to take AP classes at the high school.
- In 6th grade, students can take Pre-AP ILA and/or Pre-AP math.

Recommended Pre-AP Entrance Criteria

- 90% of answers correct on STAAR in area of application (previous school year)
- Cumulative classroom average of 90 or higher in the area of interest (current school year)
- Willingness to work hard and be challenged

Additional Services

- Gifted & Talented (GT) Students must qualify for the GT program
 - GT services are provided in an Integrated Language Arts class
 - Jonda Robinson 6th Grade GT teacher will be available to answer questions in room 614

Additional Services

- Special Education / 504 Services Students must qualify for these services
 - Wester representatives will participate in transition ARDS to offer guidance on scheduling
 - Inclusion support, resource class, SPED study skills, and other services as needed

- During the year, if a student who is not already in a lab class is found to be struggling in reading and/or math, he/she can be placed into the corresponding lab class.



Student Registration Information

By signing below, the parent/guardian understands and acknowledges the following statements:

Pre-AP, Pre-AP Algebra I, and Spanish Expectations

Students are encouraged to challenge themselves by taking Pre-AP courses, but should expect an additional time requirement. A student who earns below a 70% in two consecutive six week grading periods will be placed on academic probation and a committee induding the student, parent, and teacher will convene to develop a plan for future success. If at the conclusion of the six weeks of probation the student again earns below a 70%, the committee will reconvene to determine if enrollment in the course is the appropriate placement. In order to enroll in Pre-AP Algebra I, a student must have successfully completed Math 8, Pre-AP Math 8, or have scored 80% or higher on the 8th Grade Math Credit by Examination (CBE).

High School Credit Course Expectations

Middle school students enrolled in high school courses should expect high standards and an additional time requirement. Beginning with the class of 2017, high school courses taken in middle school will count in a student's high school GPA calculation. Students must follow all high school requirements for these courses. More information on how GPA will be calculated for these courses can be obtained from your student's counselor. Parents of students enrolled in high school credited courses are encouraged to read the high school academic guide and academic portion of the high school handbook. Instruction to Support Future Academic Success (all grade levels)

Students identified as needing additional math and/or reading instruction will be placed into a math and/or reading lab class. This class will take the place of an elective class. Texas Administrative Code requires remediation for any student who fails to demonstrate satisfactory performance on any section of the State assessments of academic skills. In addition, students who narrowly met State assessment passing standards may be included in remediation during and before or after the regular school day.

New Students

Students transferring from another Texas school must provide STAAR results from the most recent administration. If STAAR results are not available immediately, please note that necessary schedule changes will be made to address any academic needs once they are received. If a student enrolls from out of state, private school, or home school, the student will complete assessments to determine if a STAAR preparation course(s) will be required.

Schedule Changes

Schedule change requests are subject to availability in the class requested, student need, and master scheduling issues. Students need to choose classes carefully. Schedule change requests will be accepted during the first week of school. A schedule change request does not guarantee that a schedule change will occur. All schedule changes must be approved by the principal or principal's designee.

Elective Course Selection

While every effort will be made to schedule students into the elective courses of their choosing, students are not guaranteed enrollment in elective courses. Enrollment numbers and master scheduling conflicts can result in a student having to be enrolled in an alternative elective choice.


