# Practicum in Veterinary Medical Applications (Vet II)

2 credits

12<sup>th</sup> grade

The practicum course is a double blocked, unpaid capstone experience designed to give students supervised practical application of knowledge and skills. Practicum experiences occur in appropriate location of an animal hospital.



After completion of 300 clinical hours, students may apply to take their CVA test through TVMA. This is a Certified Veterinary Assistant Certification recognized by the state of Texas.
